The history of the company dates back to 1913 as a family enterprise. Since its foundation the company has been owned by the Engels family. Today the company is run by the fifth generation of the family.

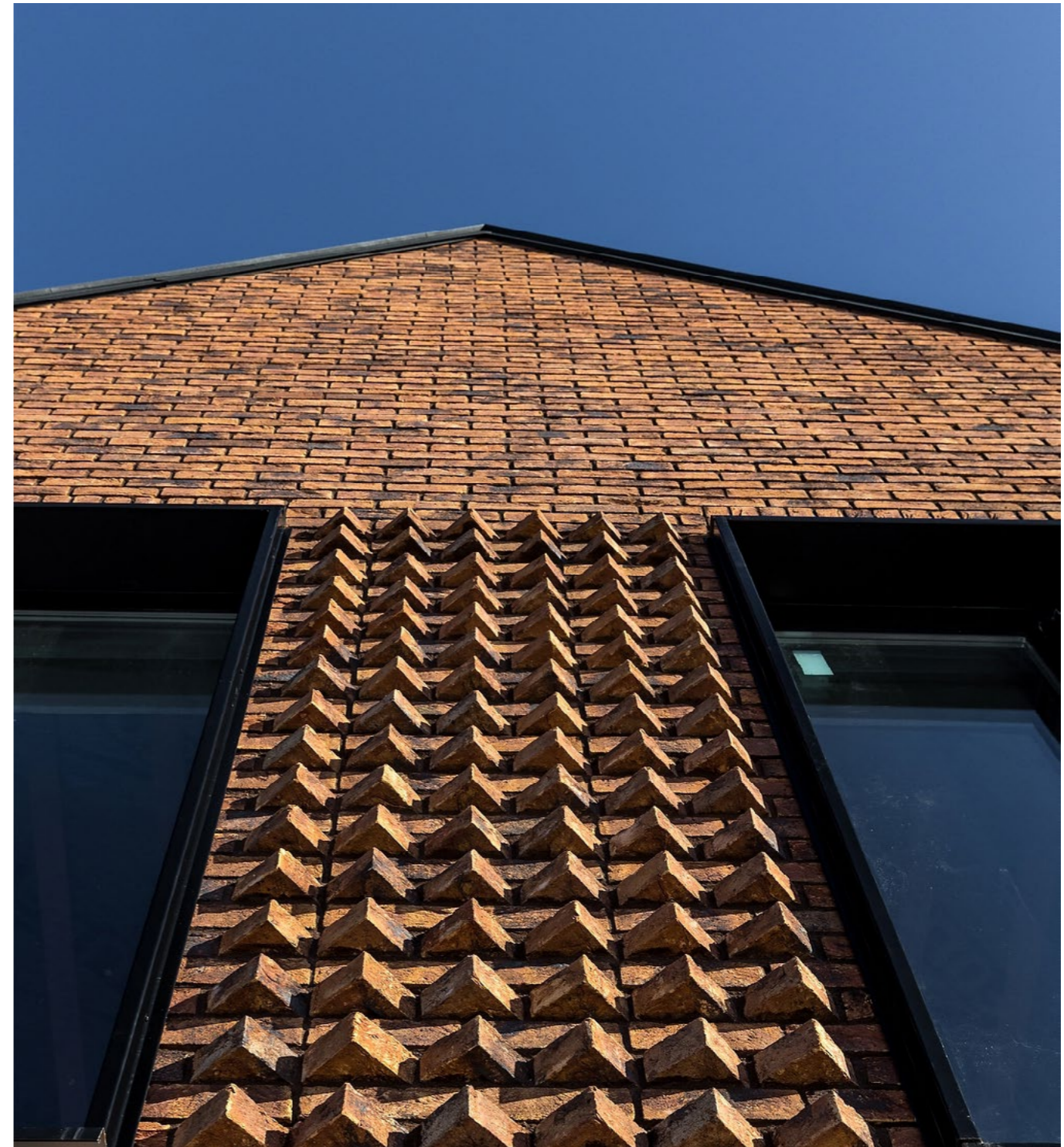
Engels Baksteen offers more than 230 different types of bricks with different colours and sizes

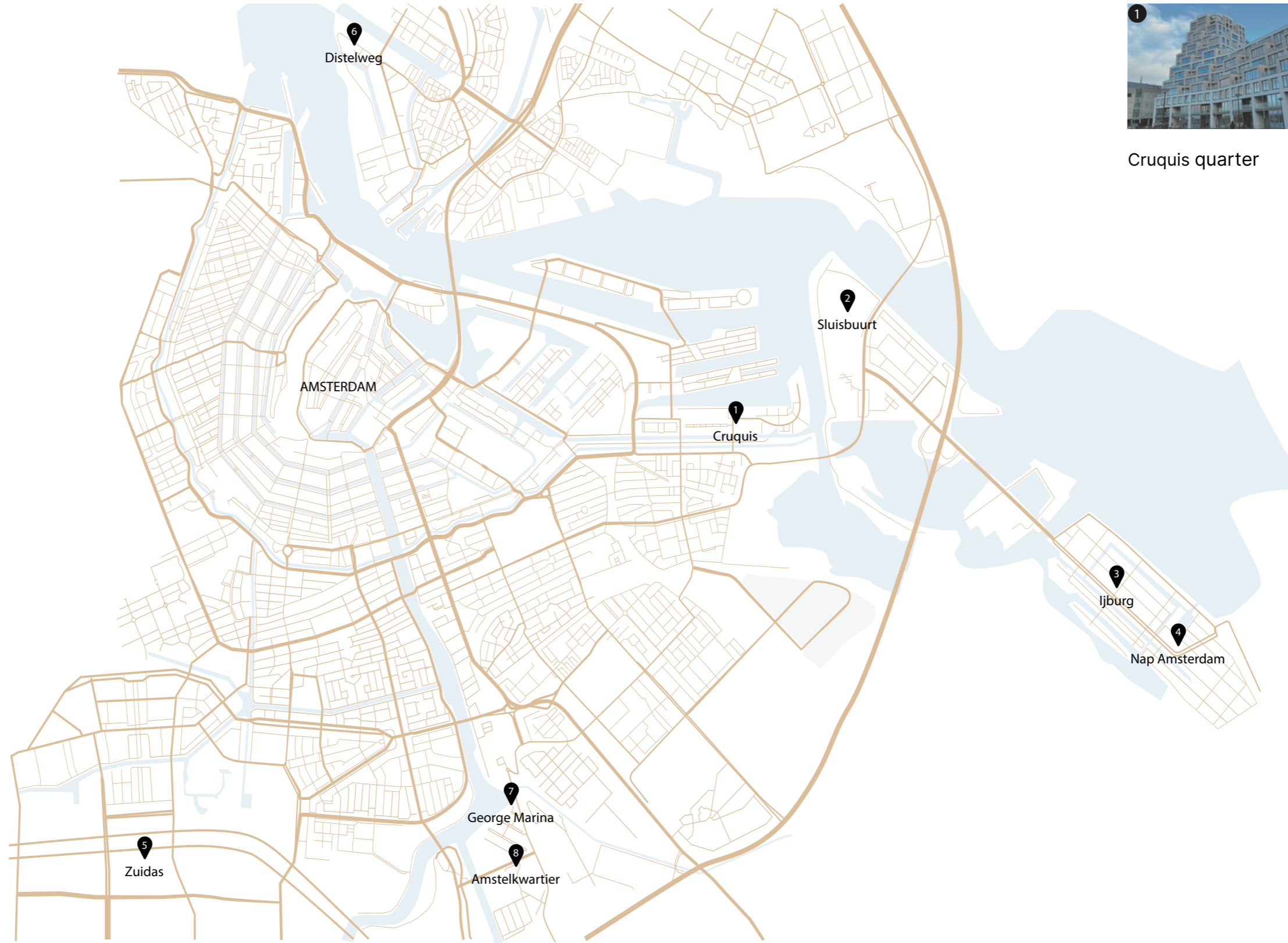
The projects of these firms regularly inspire artists, urban planners and designers from all over the world to create architecture of the future: unconventional, controversial, and attention-grabbing.

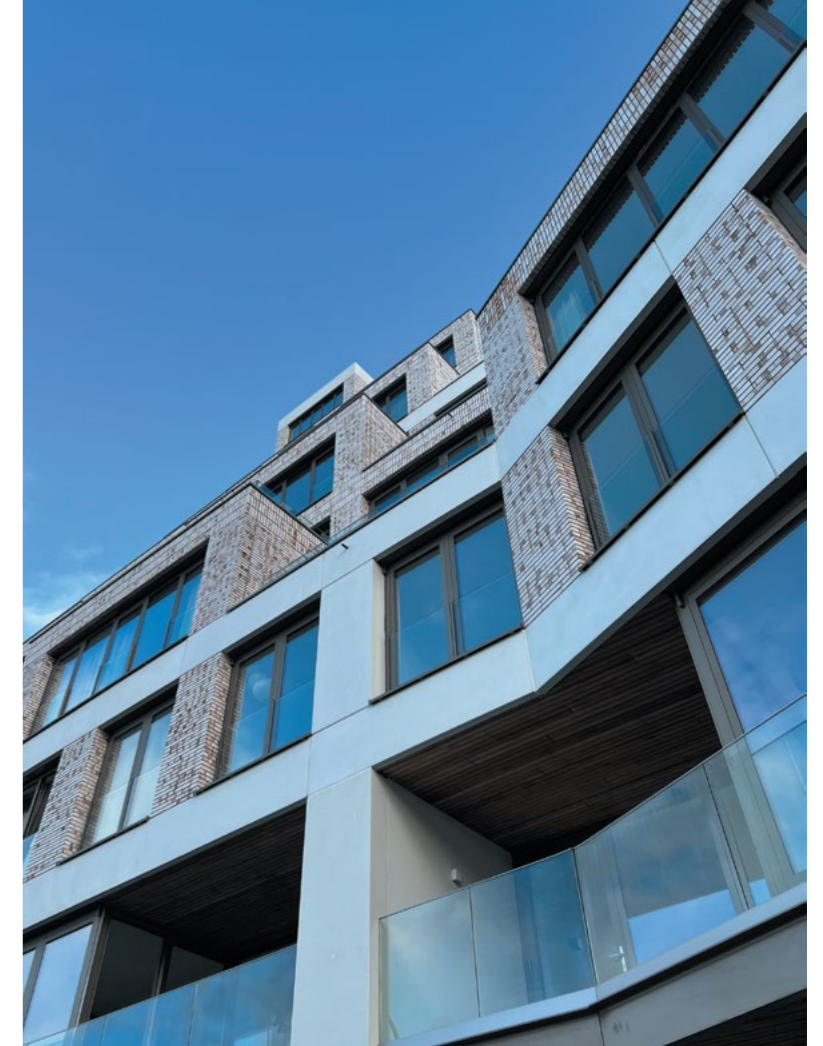
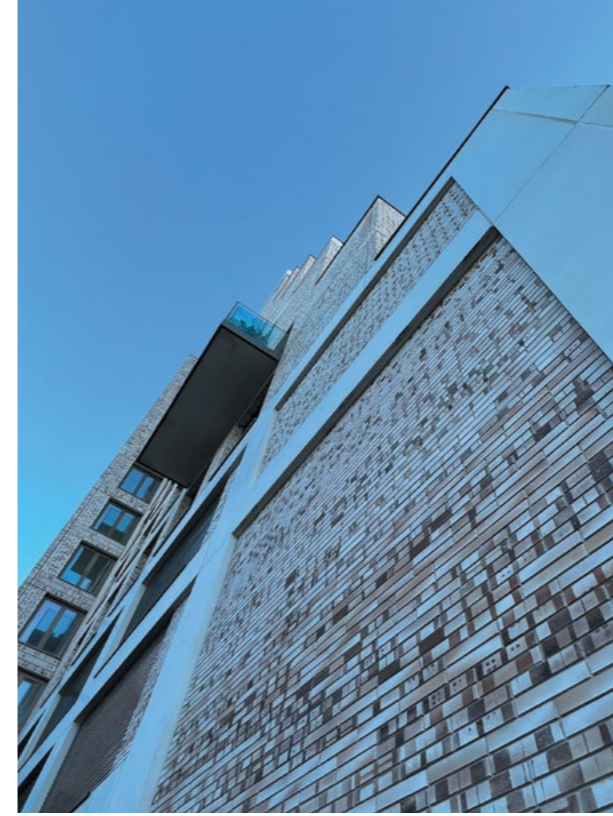

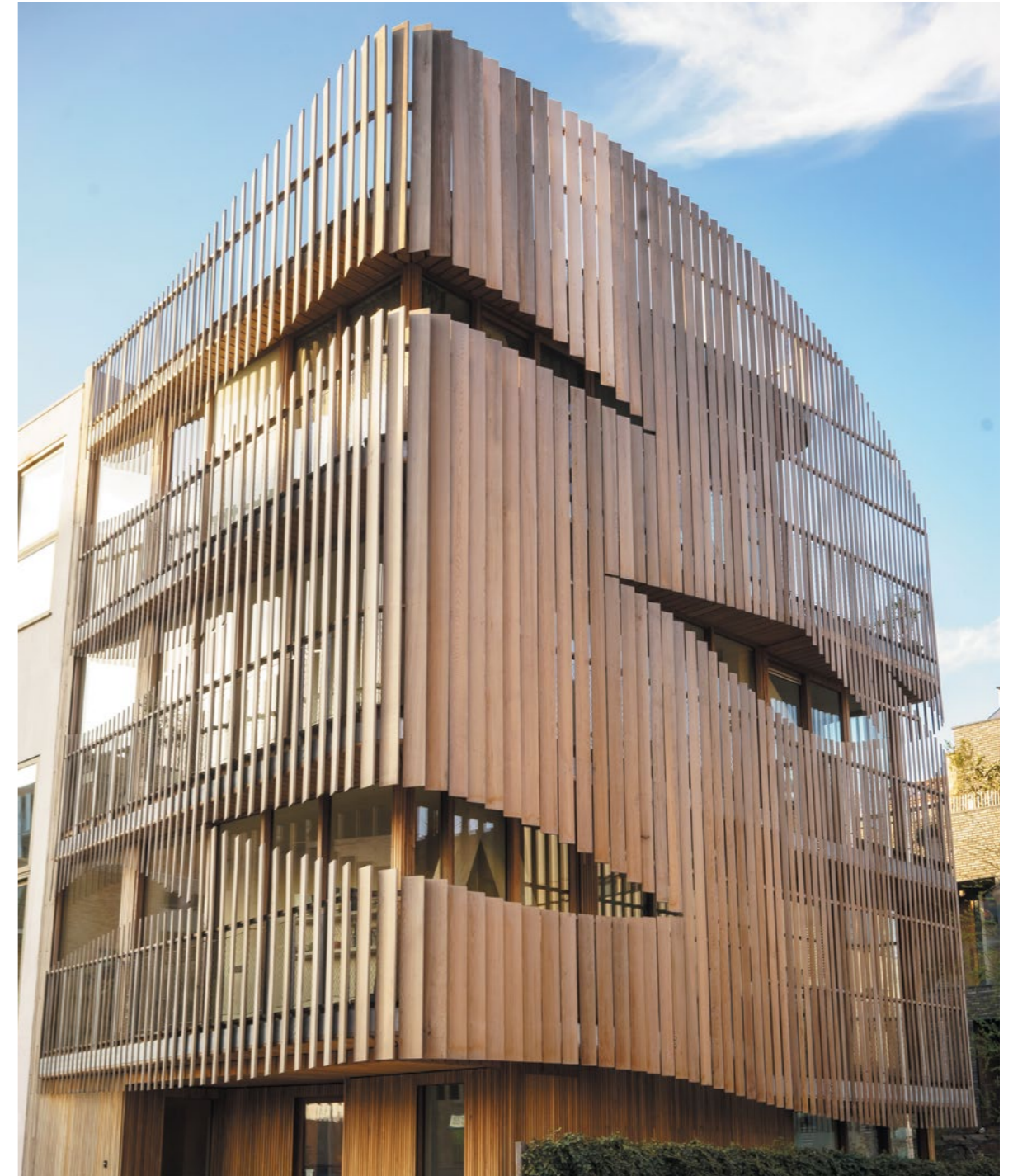
1 Cruquis quarter





2 Sluisbuurt quarter

The Sluisbuurt quarter is an example of construction on land reclamation and consists of low, medium and high-rise buildings.



The most advanced ideas and modern technologies in the field of facade solutions, arrangement of house territories and landscape design are skillfully applied here.



3 Ijburg quarter

Ijburg is another example of the creation of a comfortable urban environment on man-made islands on Lake Eijmer. Because of the housing shortage in Amsterdam, floating houses on the water have been built here, moored at the piers like boats.





5 Zuidas quarter

Zuidas is the financial district of the Dutch capital, where international business, exclusive restaurants and shops set the tone. This is where Amsterdam's World Trade Centre Amsterdam and the offices of major international corporations are located.

Zuidas has been most influenced by the business districts of La Défense in Paris and Canary Wharf in London.

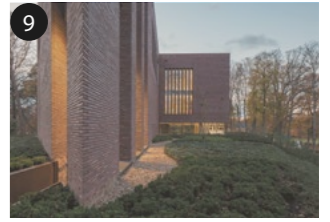
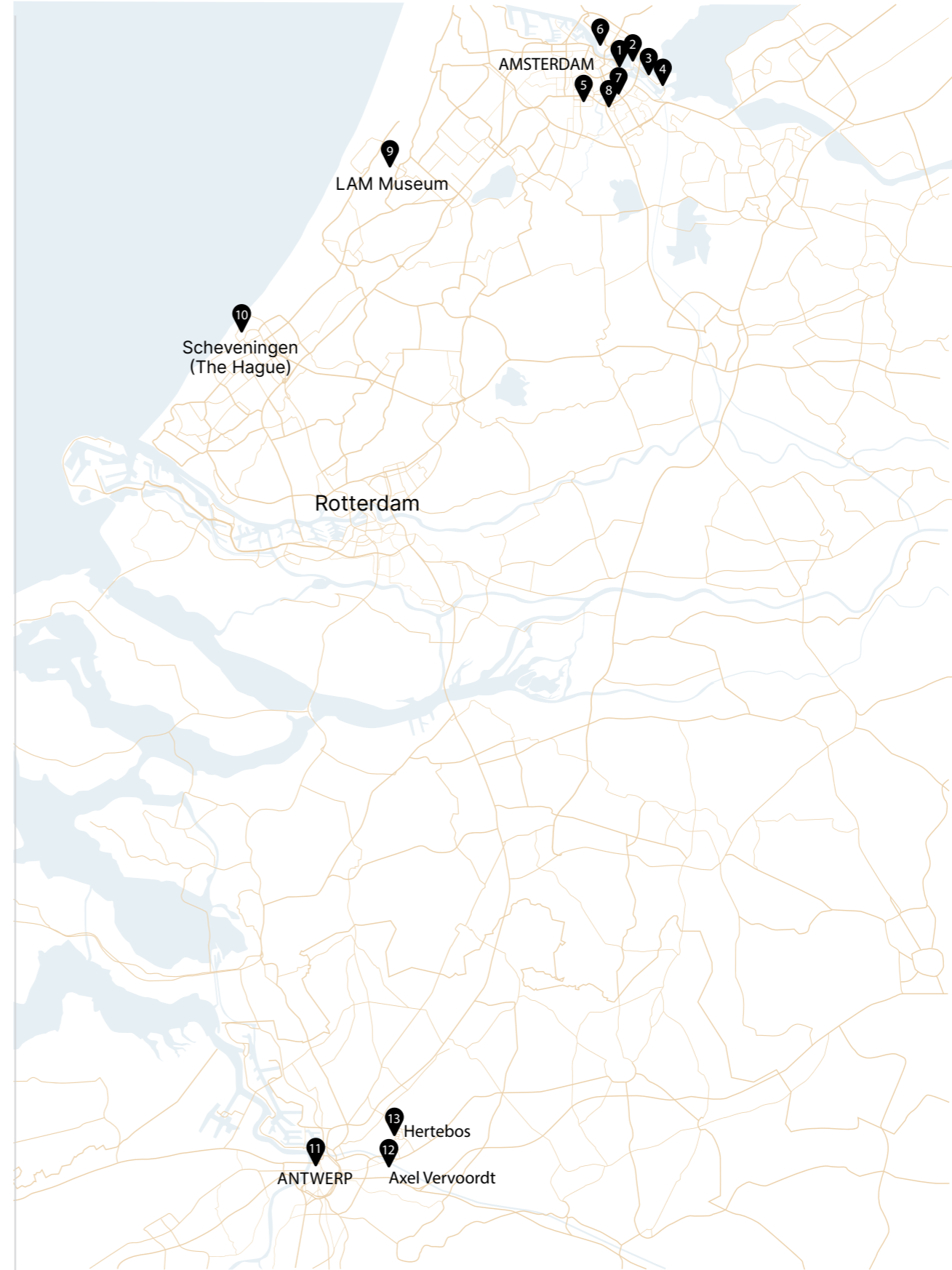
8 Amstelkwartier quarter



A former industrial area, slowly but steadily transforming into a new residential and working-class neighbourhood. The iconic buildings in the area are the monumental buildings of the former Zuidergasfabriek factory, which are being converted into residential buildings. In the coming years thousands of houses with schools and restaurants will be built in the area. In 2021, the tallest wooden skyscraper, HAUT, was completed here, designed by the Dutch architecture studio Team V Architectuur.

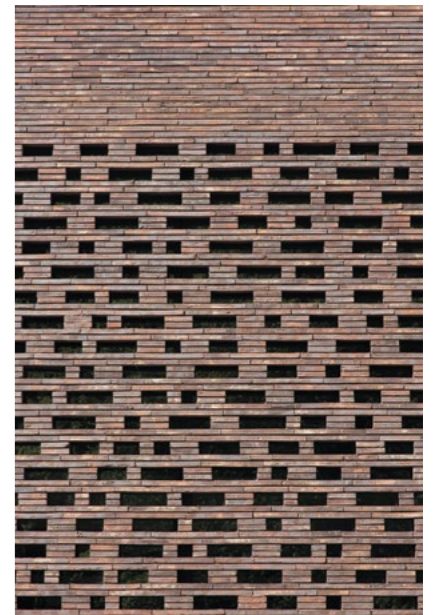

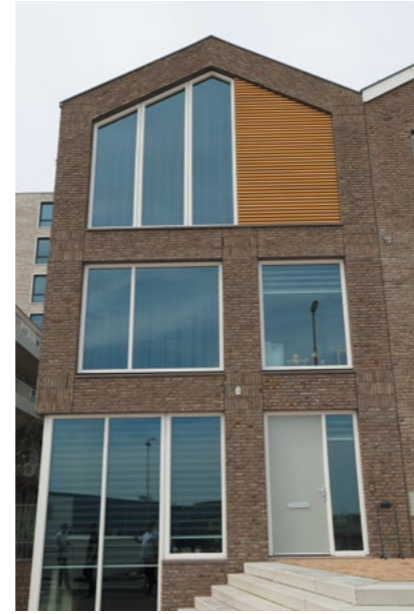

9 LAM Museum

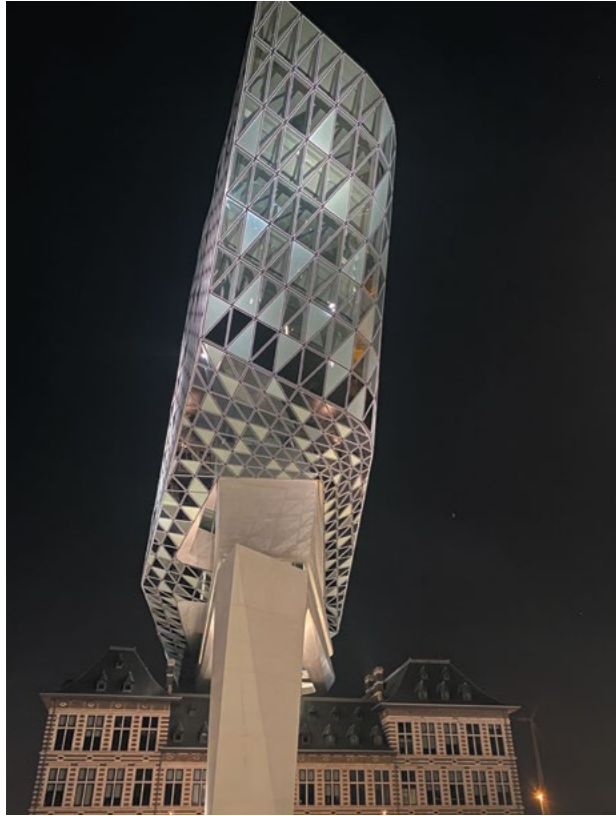
The Lisser Art Museum (LAM) is an innovative museum that will make you see familiar things in a new way. A special challenge for the architects was to blend the museum into its natural surroundings. This is why the concrete columns supporting the upper building are covered in bark, and the shades of the brick façades harmonise perfectly with the colours of the surrounding nature.





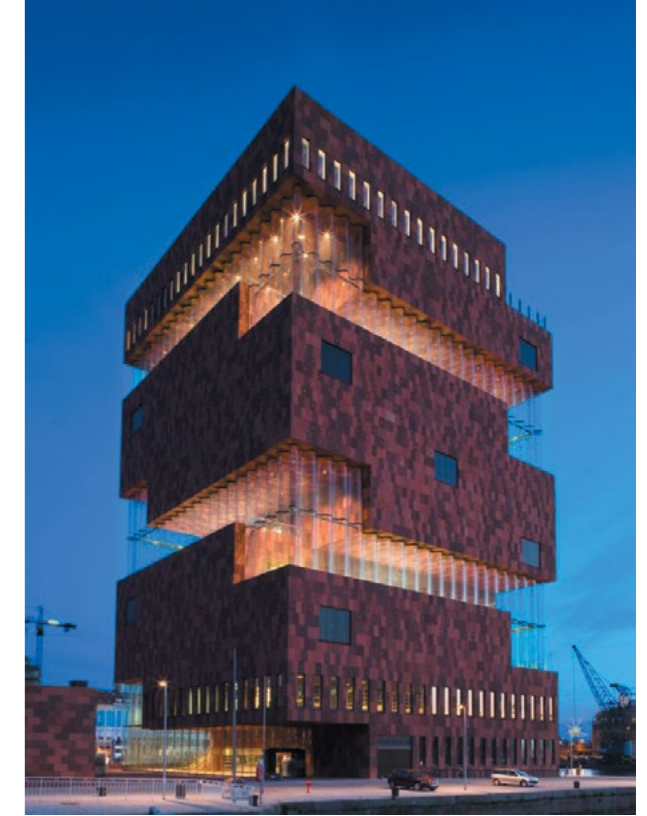
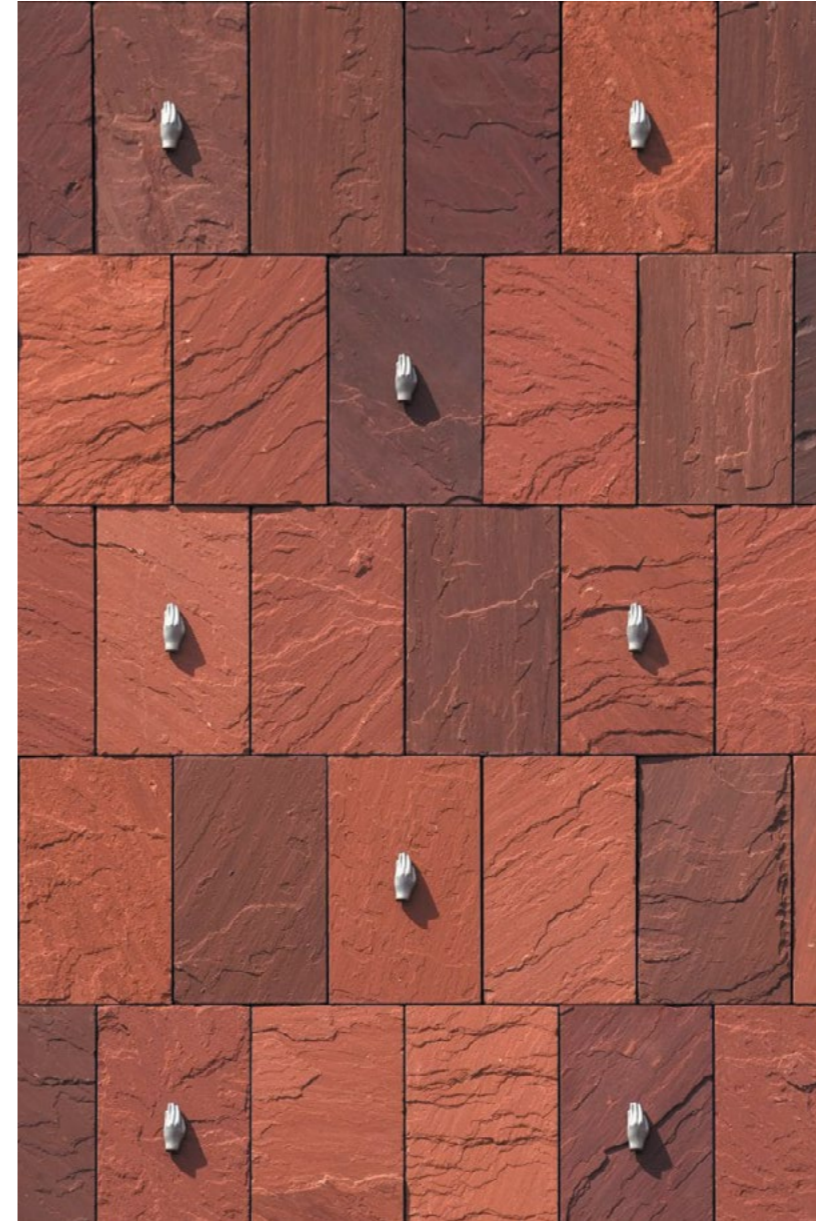
10 Scheveningen (The Hague) quarter

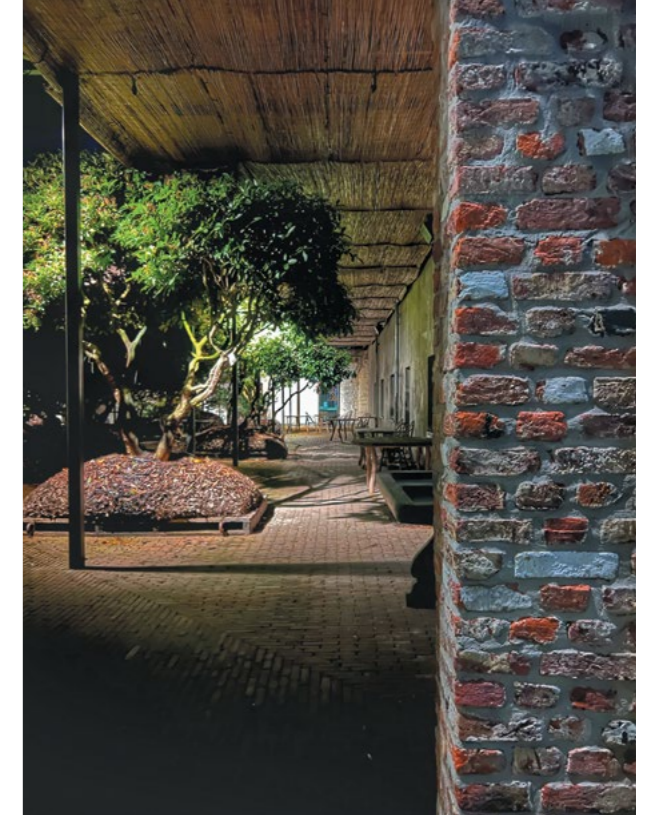
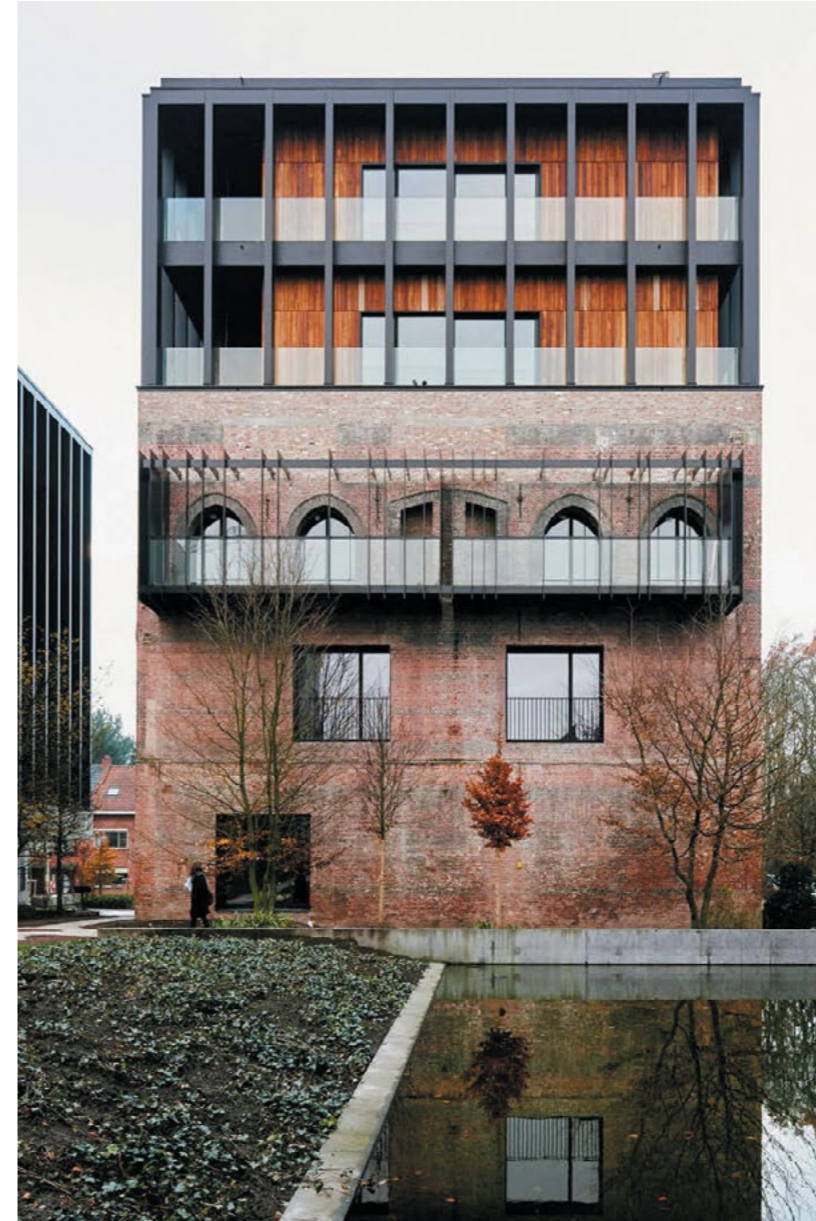
An interesting project in the seaside resort area of Scheveningen in The Hague. All the façades are made from a mix of different Engels Baksteen brick collections. The architect's main idea in realising the façades was the seamless transition in colour from one collection to the next.



11 Antwerp's iconic architectural masterpieces

Antwerp is a city of medieval buildings and stylish modern buildings, such as the impressive tower of the Gothic Notre Dame Cathedral, the MAS Museum, the Zaha Hadid-designed Antwerp port authority building and numerous Art Nouveau gemstone houses.

14 Hotel Rubens - Grote Markt

16 Engels Baksteen factory

The Helden plant underwent a complete modernization in 2019. It is currently Europe's most modern plant for the production of hand-formed bricks. The production capacity of the plant is 70 million hand-formed bricks per year. The factory produces full-bodied hand-molded bricks in unique color solutions with high technical indicators.





17 Van der Valk Hotel Het Arresthuis

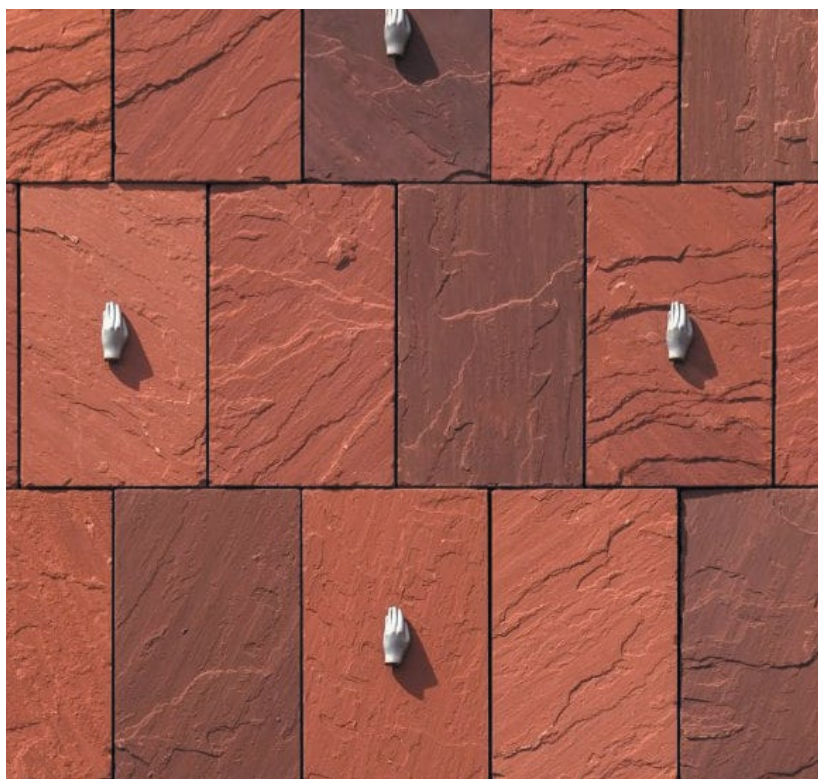
